Envirothon

Caswell Soil & Water Conservation District and Farm Credit (Caswell Office) annually sponsor teams to compete in the Area 3 Regional Envirothon. The Envirothon is a hands-on environmental and natural resource competition for middle and high school students that helps develop environmentally aware youth that may be interested in pursuing natural resource careers. This year Caswell has one team from Bartlett Yancey consisting of 5 members that have spent months studying under the leadership of Bartlett Yancey AG teachers, Sarah Smith and Stephanie Hollifield. The one-day competition takes place at Elon University in March. The students will train and compete in Aquatics, Forestry, Soils, Wildlife and Current Environmental Issues. Teams that place in the top 7 in the Area Envirothon, will go on to compete at the State Envirothon in May that is held at Cedarock Park in Burlington. We wish our team **GOOD LUCK!!**

Resource Conservation Workshop

Caswell Soil & Water Conservation District sponsors one Caswell County student to attend the Resource Conservation Workshop at NC State. The workshop will be held June 23–28, 2019 and is open to high school students.

The Resource Conservation Workshop (RCW) is a weeklong workshop that involves study and hands-on participation in a wide range of conservation topics, including: soil characteristics and soil conservation, wildlife and fisheries management, forest management, nonagricultural uses for soils, water quality and watershed management, and more. Students are housed at NC State University campus dormitories under the guidance of live-in counselors.

Students will learn about natural resources and their management in today's global environment. Awards and scholarships can be won and are presented to the students under several awards programs.

Hannah Thompson named DIII National Player of the Week

Hannah Thompson was named DIII National Player of the Week by Fastpitch News. Hannah is the daughter of Mitch Thompson (Caswell Soil & Water District Technician) and Rhonda Thompson. Hannah is a freshman at Averett University.

Hannah's positions on the field are pitcher and shortstop. She went 3-1 in five appearances in the circle last week for Averett. Hannah tossed a total of 23.0 innings, allowing four runs (two of which were earned) on 11 hits with two walks and 30 strikeouts. In two losses to No. 1 ranked Virginia Wesleyan University, Hannah took one of the defeats while totaling six innings and allowing just one earned run with six strikeouts. She collected two complete-game wins during the week in victories over Ferrum College and Brevard College. Against Ferrum she struck out a career-high 11 batters. Her third victory of the week came in a 6-2 win over Eastern Mennonite University on Sunday as she went five shutout innings, allowing one hit with eight strikeouts.

She also had an incredible week at the plate, batting .600 while going 15-for-25 over eight games. She totaled 11 RBIs with four doubles, two home runs and a stolen base, slugging 1.000 with a .615 on-base percentage.

Hannah also earned USA South Rookie Pitcher of the Week honors on Monday for the fourth time this season.

She was one of two Division III National Players of the Week selected by Fastpitch News, which honors two players each week from each division.
